## 1. How Is Our Sexuality Determined?

# The Big Idea:

God created us as male and female. Marriage was ordained by God between one man and one woman to become one in flesh and to create a family that loves God and others. Our bodies are anatomically designed perfectly to fit together for pleasure, comfort and procreation. Although not everyone will get married or have children, this union is the only natural way for the human race to continue to the next generation.

"So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. Then God blessed them and said, "Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it."

**Genesis 1:27-28a (NLT)**

"Then the LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper who is **just right for him**." <sup>19</sup> So the LORD God formed from the ground all the wild animals and all the birds of the sky. He brought them to the man to see what he would call them, and the man chose a name for each one. <sup>20</sup> He gave names to all the livestock, all the birds of the sky, and all the wild animals. But still there was no helper just right for him. <sup>21</sup> So the LORD God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep. 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### 2. How Does God Intend Us To Use Our Sexuality?

# The Big Idea:

Sex is designed by God to be a mutual beautiful expression of love, intimacy, pleasure, comfort, affection, and procreation that belongs in a monogamous marriage between a man and a woman as husband and wife. Sex is not neutral, but connects us physically, emotionally, and spiritually to the other person.

"Now regarding the questions you asked in your letter. Yes, it is good to live a celibate life. But because there is so much sexual immorality, each man should have his own wife, and each woman should have her own husband. The husband should fulfill his wife's sexual needs, and the wife should fulfill her husband's needs. The wife gives authority over her body to her husband, and the husband gives authority over his body to his wife. Do not deprive each other of sexual relations, unless you both agree to refrain from sexual intimacy for a limited time so you can give yourselves more completely to prayer. Afterward, you should come together again so that Satan won't be able to tempt you because of your lack of self-control. **1 Corinthians 7:1-5 (NLT)**

So I say to those who aren't married and to widows—it's better to stay unmarried, just as I am. But if they can't control themselves, they should go ahead and marry. It's better to marry than to burn with lust." 1 Corinthians 7:7-9 (NLT)

"God's will is for you to be holy, so stay away from all sexual sin. Then each of you will <b>control</b> his own body and live in <b>holiness and honor</b> —

"God's will is for you to be holy, so stay away from all sexual sin. Then each of you will **control** his own body and live in **holiness and honor**—not in lustful passion like the pagans who do not know God and his ways. Never harm or cheat a Christian brother in this matter by violating his wife, for the **Lord avenges** all such sins, as we have solemnly warned you before. God has called us to live holy lives, not impure lives. Therefore, anyone who refuses to live by these rules is not disobeying human teaching but is rejecting God, who gives his Holy Spirit to you."

# 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8 (NLT)

What is clearly part of God's will for every Christian?

What will be the Lord's response for those who violate this warning?

"Someone else will say, 'Food is for the stomach, and the stomach is for food.' Yes; but God will put an end to both. The body is not to be used for sexual immorality, but to serve the Lord; and the Lord provides for the body. God raised the Lord from death, and he will also raise us by his power. You know that your bodies are parts of the body of Christ. Shall I take a part of Christ's body and make it part of the body of a prostitute? Impossible! Or perhaps you don't know that the man who joins his body to a prostitute becomes physically one with her? The scripture says quite plainly, 'The two will become one body.' But he who joins himself to the Lord becomes spiritually one with him. Avoid immorality. Any other sin a man commits does not affect his body; but the man who is guilty of sexual immorality sins against his own body. Don't you know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who lives in you and who was given to you by God? You do not belong to yourselves but to God; he bought you for a price. So use your bodies for God's glory."

# 3. What Happens When We Misuse Our Sexuality?

# The Big Idea:

When we sin sexually it breaks God's heart and creates a wall where God will not listen to our prayers. Marriage between a man and a woman is designed by God and is to be honored for a lifetime. This beautiful relationship should have a foundation of love, honor, and mutual respect toward each other. When we fail to practice these foundational truths in our relationship it has a spiritually, psychologically, and socially harmful effect on us, our children, and future generations.

"In the same way, you husbands must give honor to your wives. Treat your wife with understanding as you live together. She may be weaker than you are, but she is your equal partner in God's gift of new life. Treat her as you should so your prayers will not be hindered."

"When you **follow** the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone **living** that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of God." **Galatians 5:19-21 (NLT)**

#### 4. What Does God Want Us To Do?

# The Big Idea:

Here is some Good News: God knows you and still loves you. He knows all your wrongful decisions and still sent His son to die on the cross for you. Although salvation is offered to everyone, it is not automatic. We must individually accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. We must consciously choose to commit all our life and will over to Christ's care and control. After we begin a relationship with Jesus, He gives us His power through the Holy Spirit to live a new life. Everyone struggles with temptations, but God is on our side. He is faithful and wants to help us overcome. Nobody has their act all together, but as a Christian we make an endeavor to resist sin and seek to gain victory over it.

"Then Jesus said to the crowd, 'If any of you wants to be my **follower**, you must **put aside** your **selfish ambition**, **shoulder** your cross daily, and **follow me**. If you try to keep your life for yourself, you will lose it. But if you give up your life for me, you will **find true life**. And how do you benefit if you gain the whole world but lose or forfeit your own soul in the process?" **Luke 9:23-25 (NLT)**

## 5. What Can We Do If We Struggle With Our Sexuality?

## Big Idea:

God has given us His Holy Spirit to provide power for us to overcome. It is important to remember that temptation isn't sin. Some struggles will be harder than others. God wants us to replace the old behavior with a new behavior. Depending on our past history and the amount of time we have spent in a sinful behavior can make overcoming an issue more difficult, but not impossible.

"At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated, and hating one another. But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of His **mercy**. He saved us through the washing of **rebirth and renewal** by the **Holy Spirit**, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life." **Titus 3:3-7 (NIV)** 

> What happens when we are saved?

"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are--yet was without sin. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." **Hebrews 4:15-16 (NIV)** 

➤ How does knowing Jesus faced temptation help us?

"No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it." 1 Corinthians 10:13 (NIV)

➤ How does God promise to help us in our temptations?

"So I say, **live by the Spirit**, and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature. For the sinful nature desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the sinful nature. They are in **conflict** with each other, so that you do not do what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under law." **Galatians 5:16-18 (NIV)** 

How does understanding the spiritual tug-a-war help us in our battle to do the right thing?

"Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed the passions and desires of their sinful nature to his cross and crucified them there."

Galatians 5:24 (NLT)

➤ What should we do with a wrongful desire?

"For you died to **this life**, and your **real life** is hidden with Christ in God. And when **Christ, who is your life,** is revealed to the whole world, you will share in all his glory. So put to death the sinful, earthly things lurking within you. Have nothing to do with sexual immorality, impurity, lust, and evil desires. Don't be greedy, for a greedy person is an idolater, worshiping the things of this world. <sup>6</sup> Because of these sins, the anger of God is coming. You **used** to do these things when your life was still part of this world. But **now is the time** to get rid of anger, rage, malicious behavior, slander, and dirty language. <sup>9</sup> Don't lie to each other, for you have stripped off your old sinful nature and all its wicked deeds. Put on your **new nature**, and be renewed as you learn to know your Creator and become like Him." **Colossians 3:3-10 (NLT)** 

➤ What are we supposed to do with our desires that are contrary to God?

"He who conceals his sins does not prosper, but whoever confesses and renounces them finds mercy." <b>Proverbs 28:13 (NIV)</b>
➤ What might be a reason why we are not experiencing victory in our struggle against sin? What does God want us to do?
"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." 1 John 1:8-9 (NIV)
What does God promise to do if we truly confess our sins and seek Him?
"So humble yourselves before God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Come close to God, and God will come close to you. Wash your hands, you sinners; purify your hearts, for your loyalty is divided between God and the world. Let there be tears for what you have done. Let there be sorrow and deep grief. Let there be sadness instead of laughter, and gloom instead of joy. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up in honor." James 4:7-10 (NLT)
➤ Sin is pleasant for a time but eventually it brings pain. Instead of celebrating our sin, how does God want us to come to Him?
➤ If we truly come to God with a humble heart, what will He do?

"Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results. Elijah was as human as we are, and yet when he prayed earnestly that no rain would fall, none fell for three and a half years! Then, when he prayed again, the sky sent down rain and the earth began to yield its crops. My dear brothers and sisters, if someone among you wanders away from the truth and is brought back, you can be sure that whoever brings the sinner back will save that person from death and bring about the forgiveness of many sins." James 5:16-20 (NLT)

Why is it important to have accountability? Who is a trusted friend that you could go to for help?
"Dear brothers and sisters, if another believer is overcome by some sin you who are godly should <b>gently</b> and <b>humbly</b> help that person back onto the right path. And be careful not to fall into the same temptation yourself Share each other's burdens, and in this way obey the law of Christ."  Galatians 6:1-3 (NLT)
> Why is it important to help each other with gentleness and humility?
"No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize fo which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us But we must hold on to the progress we have already made." Philippians 3:13-15, 17 (NLT)  > What is the key to progress?

"Dear brothers and sisters, pattern your lives after mine, and learn from those who follow our example. For I have told you often before, and I say it again with tears in my eyes, that there are many whose conduct shows they are really enemies of the cross of Christ. They are headed for destruction. Their god is their appetite, they brag about shameful things, and they think only about this life here on earth."

# Philippians 3:17-19 (NLT)

What impact can we have on the lives of others? Why is it important to match up what we say and what we believe?

"The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for ALL to come to repentance." 2 Peter 3:9 (NASB)

➤ If God is going to punish sin, then why is He waiting?

"Don't you see how wonderfully kind, tolerant, and patient God is with you? Does this mean nothing to you? Can't you see that His kindness is intended to turn you from your sin? <sup>5</sup> But because you are stubborn and refuse to turn from your sin, you are storing up terrible punishment for yourself. For a day of anger is coming, when God's righteous judgment will be revealed. <sup>6</sup> He will judge everyone according to what they have done. <sup>7</sup> He will give eternal life to those who keep on doing good, seeking after the glory and honor and immortality that God offers. <sup>8</sup> But He will pour out his anger and wrath on those who live for themselves, who refuse to obey the truth and instead live lives of wickedness."

"The hour has come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. <sup>12</sup> The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. <sup>13</sup> Let us behave decently, as in the daytime not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery not in dissension and jealousy. <sup>14</sup> Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and <b>do not think</b> about how to gratify the desires of the sinful nature." <b>Romans 13:11-14 (NIV)</b> > How does God want us to behave?

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. <sup>2</sup>Let us **fix our eyes on Jesus**, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. <sup>3</sup> Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. <sup>4</sup> In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood." **Hebrews 12:1-4 (NIV)** 

How does focusing on Jesus help us gain victory?
"So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their <b>thinking</b> . They are darkened in their understanding and separated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the <b>hardening of their hearts</b> . Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to <b>sensuality</b> so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, with a continual lust for more. You however, did not come to know Christ that way." <b>Ephesians 4:17-20 (NIV)</b>

## 6. Where Does The Church Stand On Sexuality And Why?

# The Big Idea:

Although there is much discussion on genetics, hormones, physiological, or psychological causes for why someone might feel a certain way sexually, the Bible clearly and consistently defines any sexual activity outside of marriage between a man and a woman as husband and wife to be sin, a rebellious act against God's plan. The Church has a responsibility to teach a lifestyle of purity according to God's standard of morality among those who claim Jesus as their Savior. The church is to teach the grace and mercy of repentance; for those who turn to God will find grace and mercy and the power to live a new life. The church should be alert to those who would try to exchange the grace of God for a license of immorality and defend the truth of the Gospel. We should not expect the world to live as believers, but we as believers in Jesus have been called to a lifestyle of purity.

"Dear friends, I had been eagerly planning to write to you about the salvation we all share. But now I find that I must write about something else, urging you to **defend** the faith that God has entrusted once for all time to his holy people. I say this because some ungodly people have wormed their way into your churches, saying that God's marvelous grace allows us to live immoral lives. The condemnation of such people was recorded long ago, for they have denied our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ." **Jude 1:3-4 (NLT)** 

> Why must the church defend our faith?
> Why is it wrong to teach God's grace allows us to live immoral lives?

"Though you already know all this, I want to remind you that the Lord delivered his people out of Egypt, but later destroyed those who did not believe. And the angels who did not keep their positions of authority but abandoned their own home--these he has kept in darkness, bound with everlasting chains for judgment on the great Day. In a similar way, Sodom and Gomorrah and the surrounding towns gave themselves up to sexual immorality and perversion. They serve as an example of those who suffer the punishment of eternal fire. In the very same way, these dreamers pollute their own bodies, reject authority and slander celestial beings." Jude 1:5-8 (NIV)

Why does Jude make a comparison between "delivered" an "destroyed" in his example?"
"I have written you in my letter <b>not to associate</b> with sexually immorate people not at all meaning the people of this world who are immoral, of the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters. In that case you would have to leave this world. But now I am writing you that you must <b>not associat</b> with <b>anyone who calls himself</b> a brother but is sexually immoral of greedy, an idolater or a slanderer, a drunkard or a swindler. With such man do not even eat. What business is it of mine to judge those outside the church? Are you not to judge those inside? God will judge those outside. "Expel the wicked man from among you."  1 Corinthians 5:9-13 (NIV)
> What was the confusion in the Corinthian church?
> What harm is it to associate with a so-called believer who practicing a lifestyle contrary to what the Bible teaches?

"If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back. But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses. If the person still refuses to listen, take your case to the church. Then if he or she won't accept the church's decision, treat that person as a pagan or a corrupt tax collector."
