You know all about how I was persecuted in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra-but the Lord rescued me from all of it. ¹² Yes, and everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution. ¹³ But evil people and impostors will flourish. They will deceive others and will themselves be deceived. ¹⁴ But you must **remain faithful** to the things you have been taught. You know they are true, for you know you can trust those who taught you. ¹⁵ You have been taught the **holy Scriptures** from childhood, and they have given you the wisdom to receive the salvation that comes by trusting in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. ¹⁷ God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work. 2 Timothy 3:10-17 (NLT2)

2. Distancing Ourselves From Temptation

Run from anything that stimulates youthful lusts. Instead, pursue righteous living, faithfulness, love, and peace. Enjoy the companionship of those who call on the Lord with pure hearts. **2 Timothy 2:22 (NLT2)**

Oh, the joys of those who do not follow the advice of the wicked, or stand around with sinners, or join in with mockers. ² But they delight in the law of the LORD, meditating on it day and night. ³ They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do. **Psalm 1:1-3 (NLT2)**

So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. ¹⁷ The sinful nature wants to do evil, which is just the opposite of what the Spirit wants. And the Spirit gives us desires that are the opposite of what the sinful nature desires. These two forces are constantly fighting each other, so you are not free to carry out your good intentions. **Galatians 5:16-17 (NLT2)**

• Why should we treat others with love and respect?

Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. • Why should we get along with others?

Since God chose you to be the holy people He loves, you must clothe yourselves with tenderhearted mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. ¹³ Make allowance for each other's faults and forgive anyone who offends you. Remember, the Lord forgave you, so you must forgive others. ¹⁴ Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds us all together in perfect harmony. ¹⁵ And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts. For as members of one body you are called to live in peace. And always be thankful. **Colossians 3:12-15 (NLT2)**

• Why should we take time out of our schedule to bless others?

"In response to all He has done for us, let us outdo each other in being **helpful** and **kind** to each other and in **doing good**." **Hebrews 10:24 (TLB)**

• Why should we carefully select friends?

"Walk with the wise and become wise; associate with fools and get in trouble." Trouble chases sinners, while blessings reward the righteous. **Proverbs 13:20-21 (NLT2)**
